Format for Paper Submission

Abstract- Mention the abstract for the article. An abstract is a brief summary of a research article, thesis, review, conference proceeding or any in-depth analysis of a particular subject or discipline, and is often used to help the reader quickly ascertain the paper's purpose. When used, an abstract always appears at the beginning of a manuscript, acting as the point-of-entry for any given scientific paper or patent application.

Index Terms- About four key words or phrases in alphabetical order, separated by commas. Keywords are used to retrieve documents in an information system such as an online journal or a search engine. (Mention 4-5 keywords)

Introduction- In Introduction you can mention the introduction about your research.

Research Elaborations- Articulate the research work with ideas gathered in above steps. In this approach combine all your researched information in form of a journal or research paper.

Results or Findings- This section has more details about your research in continuation with the above section.

Conclusion- A conclusion might elaborate on the importance of the work or suggest applications and extensions.

Appendix- Appendixes, if needed, appear before the acknowledgment.

Acknowledgement- Most academic papers have many people who have helped in some way in the preparation of the written version or the research itself. You can acknowledge them in this section.

References- A list of references in standard format with proper numbering in the Text at relevant places may be given here.
